The Importance of Celebrating Canadian Holidays in our Schools

When my daughter started ELK in the fall of 2014, I was excited for her to attend my childhood school and have all the wonderful experiences that I had as a child. But schools have changed since 1984. That became painfully clear as Halloween approached and parents received a letter home that costumes would not be allowed, and instead students would be able to wear 'black and orange'.

Not sure if I missed something, but the last time I checked, 'Black and Orange Day' was not a holiday. I soon learned that many parents planned on ignoring the letter and sending their children in costumes anyways. I followed suit, and when I picked my daughter up on October 31st that year, every student I passed was wearing a costume. A silent revolution, you'd say. Yay, parents.

Luckily, Halloween still flourishes at my kids public school, as does a vibrant Holiday concert (where the word 'Noel' is freely used). But this school and ones like it seem to be the exception these days. More and more schools are choosing to censor Canadian

holiday traditions, or worse transform them into Frankenstein holidays with little to no meaning.

Why is it that as Canadians we can't stand up for our cultural traditions without being labeled as marginalizing minorities? We are just too polite and accommodating - so much so, that our cultural traditions are now fading from our schools. We do have to be

sensitive to other cultures and minorities in our midst, but not by ignoring our own cultural traditions. Schools are reflections of society. If we allow holidays to vanish from or be transformed in our schools, what are we teaching this generation of children about our Canadian cultural traditions? As Canadians, we should be open to new traditions and learning about other cultures populating our borders, but not by forsaking

CURFEW FOR KIDSan F.Y.I.

Reminder to parents that children under 16 can't be in a public place after midnight. The OPP is reminding parents that there is a curfew in place in Ontario for children under the age of 16.

As winter holidays and early dark provide more freedom and therefore more opportunities for mischief, especially after the sun goes down, the OPP have issued a release reminding parents of the curfew. Typically, police see a spike in things like vandalism, mischief, shoplifting, loitering, trespassing, under-age drinking and general noise complaints. There are curfew provisions under the Child and Family Services Act. Under the act, no parent of a child less than 16 years of age shall permit the child to loiter in a public place between midnight and 6 a.m. This offence is punishable by fine if warranted and youth can be apprehended by police without warrant and taken to their parent/caregiver.



Venison/Bear/Moose Goulash Recipe by Sean Gray

Now that most of the big game hunting has come to an end, it's time to enjoy some of the fruits that a successful hunt has to offer.

As a kid, I can remember my dad making this delicious meal he called "goulash". I think dad usually used beef, but as an avid hunter, I began using wild game, and the recipe comes out just as good. If you like stew, you will love this!

Ingredients:

- -2lbs of your favorite ground meat (bear, deer, or moose) -1 head of broccoli or a bag of frozen brussel
- sprouts
- -1 large onion
- -2-3 large carrots
- -2-3 stalks of celery
- -2 packs of fresh mushrooms (canned can work)
- -1.5 cups of frozen peas or corn
- -3 tablespoons of olive oil
- -2 tablespoons of butter
- -salt to taste
- -pepper to taste (Llike lots!!)
- -1 tablespoon of Montreal Steak Spice (I add more
- -1 teaspoon of garlic
- -1/2 3/4 cups of cream
- -1 teaspoon of basil
- -1 teaspoon of oregano
- -1 or 2 bay leaves
- -1-2 cups of baby spinach if you like
- -2-3 cans of Campbells Cream of Mushroom soup -a splash of water or beer if needed to get things

Directions:

1.In a large saucepan at medium heat, add olive oil, and butter until melted.

- 2. Add the ground meat and onions to begin browning meat. Once meat is browned (you may have to transfer to a stew pot depending on size of sauce pan), add all veggies and spices and mix well.
- 3. Once the meat and veggies are mixed well, add the mushroom soup and mix well again. Allow the mixture to simmer covered for about 10-15 minutes mixing regularly.
- 4. Once the mushroom soup liquefies add the cream and reduce heat to low and allow the dish to simmer for about 45 minutes stirring occasionally.
- 5. Once veggies are to your preferred texture the dish is done. You may add cream to create your desired thick-
