



You will need to leave your name and phone number if routed to an answering service. You don't always get to speak with a live person so be prepared to leave a message with the items required above. It takes up to 2 weeks to repair so be sure to write down the date you called and follow up in 2 weeks if it is not repaired.

### A little bit about......Christine Allen

St John's- 48 years, Church councillor- 20 years, OFCAN- 8 years, Library committee- 9 years Pastoral Charge Official Board-20 years Falls Food- 5 years, TOPS Weight Loss group-16 years. Secretary, teacher, superintendent, weight recorder, executive committee member, chairperson, general member and volunteer. She is truly the "poster child" of community involvement.

Chris Allen has selflessly dedicated herself to the betterment of our community. Onaping Falls was blessed when Christine Poole met Jim Allen and chose to put down roots here, in 1967.

Previously, Chris called a variety of other communities home, from her birth place in Shropshire, England to Toronto, Hamilton, Nakina and finally Onaping. She successfully navigated her education across continents and the province of Ontario; attending a total of nine schools. Some as large as Central Hamilton High with an enrollment of thousands to the small school in Nakina which housed 4 grades per classroom! Upon completing her education at CVDCS, she worked at Canadian Bank of Commerce and later TD Bank.

While staying at home with her children, Chris provided child care for parents working outside the home. Allen looks upon her years of volunteering with fond memories; some of her favourite memories: "Came from St. John's Sunday School, when the mines were booming and we had close to 100 children; we did many fund raising, fun projects to support an overseas foster child. When our Library committee was active, we held bake sales, raffles etc to support families and buy gifts for needy children at Christmas, when there was no food bank in the community. St John's Senior Choir has also created great memories for me." When asked why she volunteered she said simply "Because I can?"

Further explaining, "I didn't expect when I was younger, to be as able as I am physically, at this stage of my life and I see that as a great blessing; with blessings come responsibilities and both of these bring great rewards. I have met (and continue to meet) wonderful people in every group, event etc in which I'm involved, from little children to folks in their nineties (even one over 100)!" Perhaps there is a secret elixir to life- and it is called volunteering? Chris wishes people realized how "Rewarding volunteering can be, most of the time. As with any undertaking, sometimes overload can occur and it's a good idea to learn when to take a step back and reestablish your priorities." Indeed, learning to say no has been something Chris has struggled with. "There are just not enough hours, days, weeks or money to help with all that needs to be done and I've never really mastered that balance." Chris names a number of people who have inspired her generosity:



Chris names a number of people who have inspired her generosity: "My dear friend Melinda (Niemi) Mott and she still inspires me today. My husband is a great cheerleader and has always been the one to 'hold down the fort' at home, when activities seemed to be piling up outside the home. Another great model for me was Rev. Fred Sorenson, he was just so generous, warmhearted and practical with a strong Spiritual nature and a hard worker at whatever he undertook."

To the spouses of those who contribute to our community and often go unnoticed -you know who you are- we thank you!

In Chris' down time she enjoys reading, knitting and walking; she and Jim maintain beautiful gardens. Their three children Matt, Karen and Val have made them proud grandparents of seven grandchildren!

Personally, Chris' gifts to our community have influenced me to get involved in whichever small way I can; observing her helping hand improve our community is an inspiration.
