Happy Birthday Queen Victoria!

The British queen was born on May 24, 1819. She was a **reigning monarch** (Queen) for 63 years, seven months and two days.

Victoria Day was declared a Canadian holiday by the government in 1845. At that time, it was celebrated with picnics, parades, sporting tournaments, fireworks and cannon salutes.

When Queen Victoria died in 1901, Canada's parliament officially named the holiday Victoria Day.

It was decided that the day would be celebrated on May 24th each year (or on May 25th if the 24th fell on a Sunday).



I had the good fortune to work in cooperation with knowledgeable and dedicated physicians over the years, with the support of excellent staff, to whom I express my gratitude.

For any compliment coming my way there were three or four for my secretary Renee Hull. She did not miss a beat.

In earlier years too, Wendy Hull was a very capable secretary and administrator. I wish to thank Dr. Jennifer Laski for her expertise and support over the years as well as contributing fresh ideas to the operation of the clinic here. Also, I would like to pay tribute to Mr. Bob Parker, who as Mayor of Levack-Onaping, and afterwards, demonstrated an appreciation of the challenges facing the primary care physician in the rural setting. Over the years too, I have received timeless support from Barbara in the operation of my practice and much of this has been spontaneously volunteered. To the operators of the pharmacy downstairs, the owners and all the staff, I send my thanks for their expertise and advice and the high level of care. I will miss working with Amanda, Chris and Norm and the same goes with Mark, Tim and Shannon and their team in Dowling from where much help as been forthcoming.

It is important for us all to look beyond this community and to the operation of Health Sciences North and the personnel there, at all levels, who provide us all with a wide range of care and expertise. My patients often expressed their appreciation for the care given there.

A little bit about Dr. Walter Kealy

In 1986 I moved my family from the healthy forests and beautiful rivers and lakes of Northwestern Ontario to the recovering landscape of the Sudbury basin. It was time to find a new home and new opportunities for four growing children.

Following recommendations from Dr. Ciaran Kealy, surgeon and first cousin of mine, we made the move. He and his wife Cathy kindly put themselves to the task of helping my family settle in, paving the way for professional and social contacts.

I was welcomed into the medical practice of the Onaping Medical Clinic by Dr. Paul Wilson and Dr. Linda Tenhunen and I settled in to work here and at the hospitals in Sudbury.

My medical practice encompassed the adult population mainly. Much time was spent focusing on diabetes , chronic obstructive by Dr. Walter Kealy



pulmonary disease, vascular disease and the scourge of tobacco. Over the thirty-four years spent here I have observed a decline in morbidity associated with the reduction in the number of smokers. The stress of a busy day at work could be offset by a person beating the smoking habit.

In the first 12 years of my work here it was not unusual to work late into the evenings because of work commitments other than office and hospital rounds. Over the latter part of my time here my practice became totally community based and my quality of life improved substantially. The extra time spent in the office helped to foster a closer relationship with people and often there was time to engage in conversation outside the realm of medicine. I felt that I became integrated into the community. From the outset people here have been very welcoming and appreciative of my decision to work here.

I have been profoundly moved by the courage and resilience of patients in the face of adversity. On the other side, more often than not, there as been joy and relief in sharing good news. It was in 1990 that I surrendered a small 10 acre farm on the Whitson river for a cottage on Windy Lake, sandwiched between two very welcoming neighbours, the Bedforth's and the Grimms, both extra ordinarily good neighbours. Hospitality and an off the wall sense of humour was the mix. In addition my wife Wendy and I befriended other people in the community close by in Onaping and Levack. Regular music sessions were a feature at the cottage on Windy Lake, the focus being on Irish traditional music, but not exclusively. The activity drew in some people in the community as well as a few of my colleagues and associates and musicians from the Greater Sudbury area and beyond.

I owe a debt of gratitude to Kevin Closs, Heather Parker and Martha Langley for contributing to several musical projects and Kevin was central to two, in every way possible. Incidentally, on Kevin's last CD of his, is a brilliant song, my favourite of all, on track 13 untitled and unlisted. It is about the arctic fox and if you know nothing at all about this fox, this song tells you all you need to know. This CD is titled "In Deep". I also have to acknowledge my music group, "the Wild Geese" who like the arctic fox could help anyone cope with the harshest of winters.
