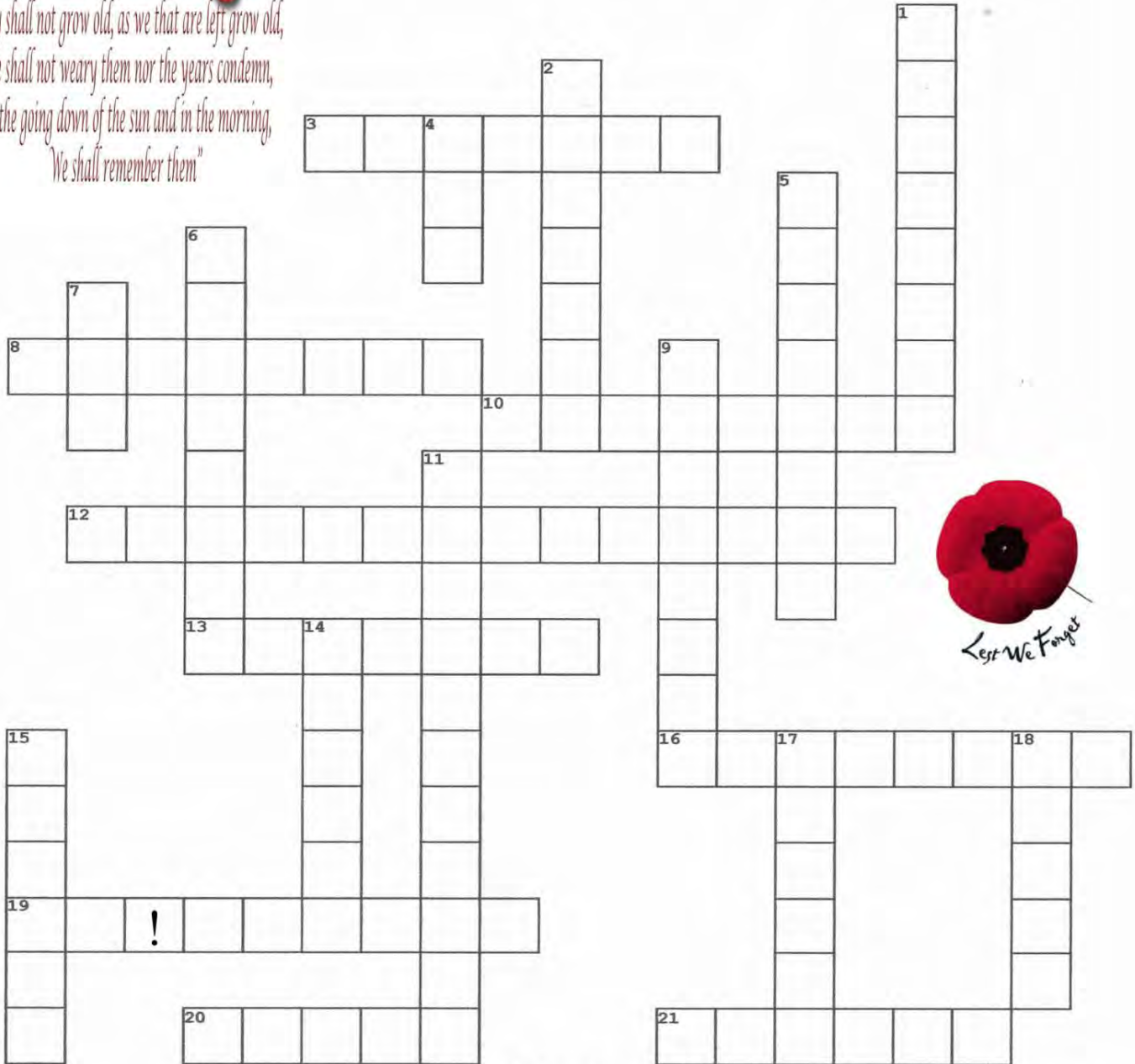

New Family Programs at Levack Public School

In September, EarlyON Child & Family Center (ON y va Chelmsford) and Our Children, Our Future (OCOF) partnered to bring **free** early learning and family support programs to Levack Public School which were previously not available within the community of Onaping Falls.

"Our families deserve equitable services and opportunities, so I made it a priority," said Enza MacEachern, principal of Levack Public School.

"Not all our families have vehicles to get to programs out of our area and the bus system is not always convenient for parents with young children so unfortunately some parents went without."

Programs offered include an Open Door program that allows parents drop in to ask questions about their child's development or behaviour, a **weekly playgroup** that gives children and their parents the opportunity to interact together in an open and welcoming environment, and **weekly cooking classes where families are taught how to prepare healthy, freezable meals that they can bring home afterwards.**

"We sent out a survey to the community during the summer with options of what programming they would be interested in and an overwhelming percentage were interested in cooking programs," said Kim Richer, Family Resource Worker at OCOF.

She adds that each free class is based on budget-friendly recipes that include a minimum of four take-home meals that can also be adapted to accommodate those with allergies or dietary restrictions.

All of the programs and services offered at Levack Public School are completely free and only require being a parent/caregiver to a child between the age of 0-12 or are expecting. Enza said that with these new programs in place, she's hoping for more parent engagement in the community and is focusing on working on more programs such as bringing a satellite food bank and clothing closet inside of Levack Public School for parents who may need this service.

Families who are interested in attending a playgroup can drop in Friday between 9:30 and 11:30 am. Those interested in cooking classes or who have questions about other resources are encouraged to contact OCOF at 705-677-0440 ext. 265.

The Impact of Cannabis Legalization

The legalization of cannabis is a major cultural shift in our country, especially since (ahem) until now we've been telling kids that 'drugs are bad'. Significant education is required to support our youth and their families in understanding how this change will impact their lives, those of their families and society at large.

In Ontario, the Cannabis Act states that users, age 19 or older, can smoke cannabis "wherever people can currently smoke cigarettes", which is 20 meters from children's parks or schools – a very short distance. Currently, in Ontario, cannabis edibles are still illegal, however they too will enter the market in the next year or so.

With this loose legislation in place, kids will begin seeing cannabis ingestion both at home and in public - who knows - maybe even outside their school if a parent decides to walk to collect their kids smoking cannabis and stays the required 20 meters away from the school.

How can educators and parents deal with this reality in a sensible and responsible way?

1. Talk to your students/kids about cannabis in an open and responsible manner. They most likely have questions about why the drug was legalized as well as what the potential benefits to users could be. If you aren't familiar with cannabis, look to the government of Ontario website: <https://www.ontario.ca/page/cannabis-legalization> to help with answering questions.

2. For older students/kids offer them newspaper or online articles to read about the legalization of cannabis in Canada and use the reading(s) as a starting point for conversation or debate.

3. Explain to students/kids what cannabis looks like (especially edible cannabis) even if it is not legal just yet. In states where cannabis has been legalized in the U.S., there have been many published incidences of kids mistaking cannabis edibles for candy and ingesting them or bringing them to school to share with friends - resulting in poisoning and hospital visits.

4. Discuss the use of cannabis as a recreational or medical drug with students and kids, but also share the medical dangers it holds for youth. Although it is legalized, that doesn't mean it is beneficial for young people while their brains are still growing and developing.

Whether or not you agree with the legalization of cannabis in Canada, it seems that it's here to stay. I

Instead of ignoring this cultural shift - take the opportunity to educate and talk to your students or kids about this important topic.

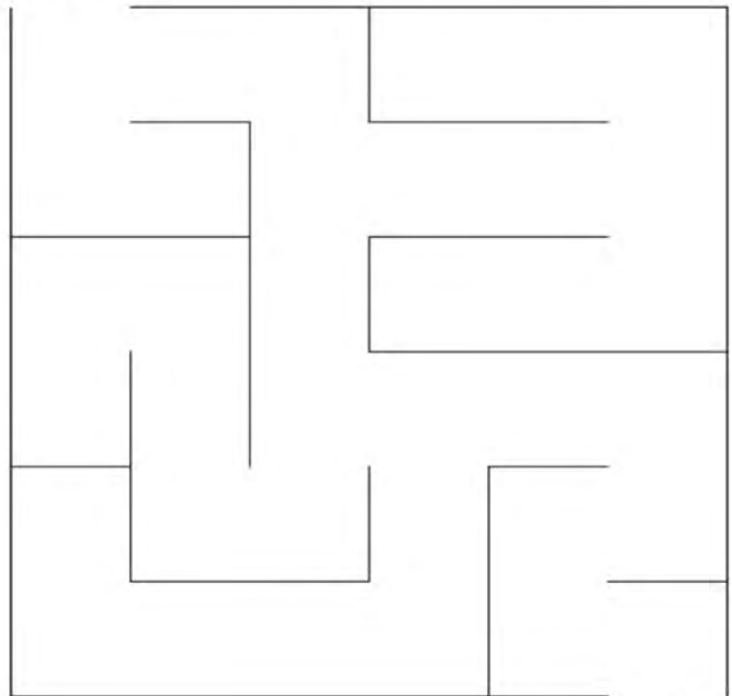

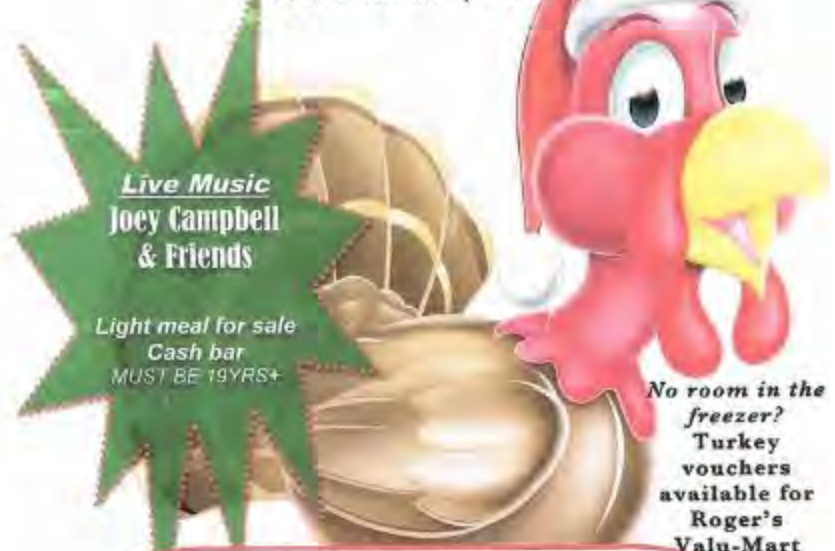

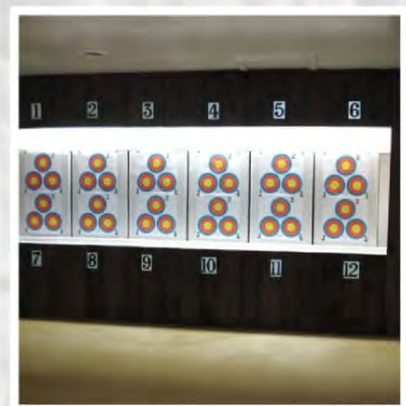
