Crafting and Maintaining a Digital Footprint with Students/Kids

Understanding media, and being able to analyze and produce it has become an essential workplace and social skill for 21st century students.

Each school year, I try to focus on one 'big' media concept or skill in each of my classes; this year we'll focus on crafting and developing a plan to maintain their digital footprints (trail of data you create while using the Internet).

We've know for years that our interactions with the Internet leave a trail, but only recently have come to understand how important it is to manage and craft this data. Crafting a positive, personal digital footprint is something that could potentially impact a student's relationships with family, friends and romantic partners, as well as education and employment prospects.

Why are Digital Footprints Important for Students/Kids Futures?

Thanks to today's digital society, it is often your first impression. Think about it when you first meet someone new....do you Google them? It effects your relationships. If your digital footprint is fully of negativity, insults and arguments, aggressive opinions or inappropriate humour you will lose followers and friends alike.

It can impact your educational options. The New York Times has recently published an article titled "The Loved your G.P.A. Then They Saw Your Tweets". Enough said.

It effects your employability. A current article in the Huffington Post cited that "80% of employers Google applicants before even offering them an interview".

How Can You Help Students/Kids 'Craft' a Digital Footprint?

Start at the end – think about what story you want in your 'digital footprint'. What should it reflect about who you are, what's important to you and what you want to accomplish in life?

Next, figure out what currently exists in your digital footprint- create a list of email addresses, social media applications and Google yourself. Analyze what is already out there and compare it to whatyou want to portray.

Cleaning up your footprint should follow. Remove images or posts that you feel don't reflect who you are or what you want the world to see.

Then, work at adding to your digital footprint: include images that you love and are personally meaningful, produce and share data that reflects your personal values, and avoid online arguments and negativity.

The final step is ongoing - you need to maintain the positive and personal digital footprint.

A HUNTING MEAL THAT WILL NOT DISAPPOINT!

As we move into October, many hunters begin to get excited about upcoming big game hunts such as moose and whitetail deer. For some of us, it's like counting sleeps before Christmas Day. Many hunters have awaited this time of year for months and are anxious to see if all the summer scouting and research is going to pay off. Because we only get to do it once or twice and tags have become limited we usually do everything we can to guarantee success. It usually begins by making frequent visits to Ramako's, Moxy's or **Ten Point Archery**. We begin spending money on the latest scents, baits, calls, ammunition, clothing and of course toe warmers:) Texts and phone calls begin between party members and discussions occur about who is going to bring what in terms of equipment, who is going to which location, and of course who is bringing what meals. I can honestly say that in all my years of the "hunt" I have not had a bad breakfast, lunch or dinner!! All the members bring great food and not a soul leaves the camp hungry......not ever. I will share a recipe this month that was given to me by my sister, but is **originally a recipe from a community member now living on Onaping Lake by the name of Graham Marshall.** This meal is great any time of the day, whether you pack it in a thermos, have it for breakfast or for dinner after a cold day.

" Hunter Smorgasbord"

1lb bacon - chopped and fried, set aside. 10 ' chunk of Brandt Kolbassa - cubed and fried, set aside

1-2 small onions diced

3-5 hot banana peppers diced

8-10 large field tomatoes - cored and cut in large chunks. stirring in eggs. 2tbs butter Simmer for about

splash of olive oil

Saute onions and peppers in butter in large pan or pot with olive oil.

Add bacon, kolbassa and tomatoes to onions and peppers and cook on low/med heat until tomatoes are stewed and simmering

Add 3-4 tbs paprika and salt/pepper to taste While simmering, add 8-10 eggs, on at a time lightly stirring in eggs.

Simmer for about 15-20 minutes longer or until egg pieces are fully cooked.

Serve with fresh toast and butter and enjoy!!

City gets 3 new Ambulances with the Latest Public Safety Technology



The City of Greater Sudbury now has **three new ambulances** and a Supervisory Paramedic Response Unit that are equipped **with new visual and auditory technology** that is designed to increase the visibility of these first response vehicles as they travel our roads on life -saving missions.

The ambulances are now furnished with **BLUE flashing lights** in addition to the current red flashing lights. They are also equipped with a new siren that drivers will not only hear but also **feel through low frequency sound vibrations** emitted by the siren.

Traditionally only found on police vehicles, on July 1, 2018, the Ontario Highway Traffic Act was amended to allow ambulances and fire vehicles to use blue flashing lights.

These measures are designed to get the attention of motorists and improve safety for the general public, our patients, paramedics and firefighters.

The human eye sees blue more brightly at night and there will be a contrast with the taillights of other vehicles.

Going forward, blue flashing lights will **become standard** equipment as the Paramedic and Fire Services get new vehicles.


