The program, sponsored by Canada Summer Jobs, employs 5 students for the summer. The students work Wednesday thru Sunday from 10 to 4. Their tasks included welcoming visitors to High Falls and educating them on its history and creating nature type activities. Visitor numbers this year were well over 8000 and those are just the visitors counted during the 30 hours a week the students were there.

The O.F.R.C. staff offered FREE art and learning programs on Fridays, Saturday and Sundays. This years programs included a visit from Tobias Roth, a Geoscience Technologist from Laurentian University. Tobias spoke of our unique geology. Pieces of ore were donated by Glencore and visitors were able to check the content of those ore pieces buy scratching them onto a streak plate .

Paddle painting and Nature Scavenger hunts were also part of the fun.

Onaping Falls Recreation Chair, Carrie Morin and O.F.R.C. Committee member Dolly Gordon run the program voluntarily which has been successful for 4 years now. Their efforts to provide local summer employment and to re-open the A.Y. Jackson Welcome Centre have been successful with the help of Marc Serre, M.P. , Gerry Montpellier, Ward 3 Councillor and Sudbury Tourism.

...Opinion: City staff has no right to bury fire services report

What are they trying to hide from Greater Sudbury taxpayers?

"I am not hesitant to say what I think; I'm not one to back away or pull punches when it comes to speaking up for our concerned residents.

Having spent hours as an expert witness in Ontario courtrooms, it shocks and offends me to be told by city staff, without council direction, of their decisions to not provide the taxpayers with the property.

Why not? What are they trying to hide from taxpayers? Is this another attempt in extending the never-ending debate that has seen cost-effective volunteer fire services wither and jeopardized in our smaller urban centres.

I am advised that staff refusing access to the report violates more than one requirement of the Municipal Act. I am prepared to fight every barrier put in my way - while adhering to my personal ethics and integrity - to satisfy provincial regulations on behalf of those that elected me.

Staff's decision not to release to city council the fire station location report is a blatant insult to our concerned taxpayers. The made-in-England report on fire services was bought and paid for by taxpayers; it belongs to taxpayers, not city staff.

Rightfully concerned citizens have seen some leaked sections and know this long overdue report has been delivered to staff. Taxpayers are demanding to be informed of all details of this report, and I wholeheartedly support those demands.

I will be asking members of council to support me in directing staff to reverse their unsanctioned decision to bury this report until after the municipal election and immediately publish the report on the city's website.

It is unfair to cause fear and uncertainty in residents, about possibly losing the fire response provisions their communities built and rely on. In the majority of Canadian cities, fire departments are staffed by professional dedicated and cost-effective volunteers. City bureaucrats and a British consultant - who never visited or consulted our communities - think their opinions are more relevant than those who built and operated fire services effectively efficiently as needed. Those services are already paid for and in place.

Besides ownership of the report, the contents of the report are critical to many outlying residents. Response and rescue times will be longer by virtue of fewer consolidated stations located farther away. More remote homes in the far reaches of the city will experience insurance rates hikes and some will probably not be able to purchase insurance. An insurance specialist spoke at the many fire optimization meetings confirmed this fact.

I will be seeking a waive of notice a the next notice at the next council meeting for this motion:

"Whereas the taxpayers of Greater Sudbury have paid for a report on fire station locations from Operational Research in Health Ltd. of Great Britain and,

"Whereas that report has been received by staff and,

"Whereas staff has decided not to release the report until after the 2022 election, without council approval,

"Be it therefore resolved that council is hereby directing staff to place the report on the Greater Sudbury website immediately."
