QUICK FALL BEAR HUNTING TIPS

By Sean 'Blue' Gray

After hunting black bears for many years, my experience has helped me land a few nice bears and not have to sit for the whole season in a tree stand to do so. The fall hunt is very similar to the spring hunt except the fact that the bears are getting ready for hibernation. Fall bears are usually looking for starchy foods: nuts, seeds, pasta, molasses covered corn mashed potatoes and popcorn are great baits! Any type of frozen meat or fish scraps also works well. I use frozen meats because it lasts longer and tends not to spoil.

If you want to shoot a bear quickly, be sure to bait at the same time everyday. Bears will get use to hearing the quad come in....... and then leave. They will quickly become conditioned to this routine and arrive shortly after you have baited. I like to bait around 4:00pm and bang the barrels, then leave on the quad and return on foot and get in my stand around an hour later. Be sure to walk in quietly and give the bait a good look for lurking bears. I have arrived to my stand many times and the bears were already in the barrel!

It is also a great idea to bait near natural food sources such as fields, oaks, blackberry patches, and pin/choke cherries. If you can find these feeding areas in saddles with a water source such as a stream or creek that is a bonus!! All in all bear hunting can be tough sometimes as bears have a keen sense of smell and hearing, however, persistence and good routines can go a long way.

On another note, October 1st is fast approaching and this is the bow opener for whitetails in many WMU's. So be sure to check your hunting regulations and begin scouting for a monster. If you are not a bow hunter and thinking about it, head on over to Ten Point Archery in Chelmsford and they can suit you up for a nice extended season of whitetail. The bow season in some areas closes on December 15th©





5 Practical Ideas for Back to School Goal Setting

Did you know that if people take the time to sit and write out their goals, they are 50% more likely to accomplish them? This is why goal setting is such an important soft skill to teach students. Teaching kids how to set, plan and achieve personal goals related to school, life and extracurricular activities is paramount – especially in September when everything is new and fresh.

Here are some of my favourite **Back to School Goal Setting Activities** that can be accomplished in the classroom or at home with a parent (goal setting is also a great family activity).

Vision Boards: Who doesn't love a good old collage? Essentially, that's what a vision board is. Ask students to create a physical (or virtual) collage of words, images, phrases that represent their personal goals, then have them display their work I n the class or a visible place in the home.

Movie Trailer: imovie has a great feature where they have pre-set 'movie trailer' shells with music, font/colours etc. I have students create a 'movie trailer' that features what their upcoming school year will look like: what themes will be present, what tone will it have, who will they spend time with, what will they do, what challenges will they face, etc. Students can then share their movie trailers with the class, or via a private social media page with parent permission.

Bucket List Writing Assignment: After introducing students to the idea of the 'bucket list', I guide them through the writing process to create a 'bucket list' of personal goals for the school year. This activity can be adapted from a basic list for younger or weaker students to a complete personal essay for advanced students.

Inquiry Based Learning Research: Giving students free rein to learn about goal setting is another strategy I like to use. I usually start with asking students 2-3 'key' questions. For example: What is the practice of goal setting? Why is goal setting an important skill to apply to life and school? How do you go about setting and achieving goals? I then set them loose with the options to both discuss with peers and do some online research alone to answer the key questions.

Use an App!: This final activity is easy and tech focused. Students are taught about the premise of goal setting, then asked to find a suitable FREE app via the app store that they can download to their phone to guide their goal setting practice. There are a plethora of apps that fit this mould, and students are encouraged to enter at least 3 personal goals to track over a given period of time.



Hillcrest Substation - Class Environmental Assessment

Sudbury Integrated Nickel Operations (Sudbury INO), a Glencore company, is proposing to construct a 115 kilovolt (kV) substation (Hillcrest Substation) and an approximately 1.5-kilometre-long 115 kV transmission line (the Project), located in the City of Greater Sudbury, near the towns of Onaping and Levack.

The Sudbury INO electrical transmission infrastructure that is currently providing supply to Sudbury INO's mining operations in the Levack/Onaping area, is reaching its end of life. The proposed Project is required to replace the existing aging and unreliable electrical infrastructure and would ensure continued safe and reliable electrical supply to Sudbury INO's existing and future Craig Mine operations. The proposed Project would strengthen the electricity system that serves Sudbury INO's current Craig Mine operation and provide opportunity for continued deep mining operations in the area, and supply the needed (additional) power for a cooling system in order to provide improved conditions for the workforce in a deep mining environment.

The proposed Project includes:

- A new 115 kV substation that would be owned and operated by Sudbury INO and located beside Strathcona Mine Road, all within Sudbury INO property which has restricted access and 24/7 security personnel.
- An approximately 1.5-kilometrelong 115 kV transmission line consisting of approximately ten pole structures. The transmission line would connect the new Hillcrest Substation to Hydro One's existing 115 kV transmission line.



This type of project is subject to the *Class Environmental Assessment for Minor Transmission Facilities* (Hydro One, 2016), in accordance with the Ontario *Environmental Assessment Act*. The Class EA is a streamlined planning process that has proven effective for minor transmission projects that have a predictable range of effects and have feasible environmental mitigation and/or protection measures in place. The Class EA process contains screening provisions that may apply to this Project.

Contingent on the outcome of the Class EA, construction of the Project is anticipated to begin as early as October 2018, with commissioning and energization occurring as early as Summer 2020.

We welcome your comments and feedback regarding the proposed Project. Your input for this Project is valued and would be appreciated by September 28, 2018.


