



#### OMBUDSMAN of ONTARIO

The **Ombudsman of Ontario** is Ontario's Watchdog. His office can help you settle problems or complaints with any provincial government organizations, administrative tribunals, municipalities, universities, school boards, child protection services, French language services and the list goes on.

They can review and investigate your complaint or connect you with the appropriate officials. They can also attempt to resolve your issue and make recommendations on ways to improve or they can recommend constructive changes.

They cannot take sides in disputes, overturn decisions made by elected officials or set public policy. They also cannot provide legal advice or representation. They do however advocate for fairness.

To bring forward your complaint, you can give them a call, fill a Complaint Form and send it electronically from their website. No internet, no problem, you can write your complaint in letter form. Your complaint can be kept confidential. There is **no charge** for their service.



## Community Heart & Soul continued.....

#### A little bit about ..... Peter Koskela

Through Peter's innovation and leadership, numerous complex and high profile cases have come to a successful resolution. Cases which have included careless hunting, forest fires and illegal hunting.

Alongside this award, he received the Shikar-Safari Club International Ontario Wildlife Officer of the Year Award and the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters (OFAH) Conservation Officer of the Year Award. Koskela is passionate about accident prevention, partaking in a 2 day event in which local students receive ski doo safety training and a guided tour of local trails. Through his MNR outreach he has initiated a number of other student programs. He takes students who would otherwise not be exposed to outdoor activities fishing in both winter and summer. As well, he has led initiatives which focus on Indigenous Students restocking fish, skinning moose and learning fishing and hunting safety. Koskela enjoys sharing his appreciation of the outdoors with young people.

Being a Conservation Officer is not just about boating and skidooing around, revelling in the outdoors. It involves, at times, high risk law enforcement. Conservation officers are usually on patrol alone and often facing armed individuals in remote locations. Extreme weather conditions can also pose a threat. Koskela is a local, he grew up in Dowling, where he attended Larchwood Public School and CVDCS before



attending Sir Sandford Fleming College where he graduated from Fish and Wildlife Technician, and Natural Resources Law Enforcement. Another local Conservation Officer inspired Koskela's career choice: "In 1976 when I was in grade 4, Conservation Officer Bob White, took our class from Larchwood Public School, to stock brook trout at local lakes and creeks around Windy Lake. This was my first exposure to a conservation officer and it was from that day forward that I was inspired. Later in my early career with MNR I made it a point to bring the children from Larchwood Public School to an unnamed lake off Old Cartier Road to stock with brook trout. I had the children name the lake, and they chose Larchwood Lake, and after 30 years the name still remains today."

Presently, Peter lives in Onaping with his partner Debra. They enjoy spending time with family at Lake Onaping. Peter also enjoys music, he can sing, play guitar and drums; he is self taught. The next time you are stopped by a conservation officer, please keep in mind, law enforcement is challenging to say the least in this vast area and at times very dangerous. Conservation officers are at risk regularly on the job; their bravery deserves to be recognized as they do their best to protect us and the environment.

# Community Heart & Soul A little bit about..... Peter Koskela

How many of us enjoy the peace and serenity of our beautiful outdoors? What activities do you partake in? Fishing? Hunting? Boating? Quading? Skidooing? Perhaps you are a Trapper? During these times have you ever encountered a Conservation Officer?

For many of us the sight of a Conservation Officer pulling up alongside us in a boat or other motorized vehicle is often cause for our stomachs to drop and sweat to start breaking out. Some of us may feel angry or defensive at their intrusion into our lovely day enjoying the outdoors. If you can identify with these feelings, perhaps now is the time to reframe your thoughts and perceptions of Conservation Officers. They are not out to ruin our good time, but rather to protect us from others who are acting unsafely. They are also entrusted with safeguarding our environment and resources so that future generations can enjoy them as much as we do.



One of these dedicated officers tasked with this

responsibility is Peter Koskela. Koskela has worked to protect us and the environment during the 30 years he has spent at the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry. He started as a fish and wildlife technician/deputy conservation officer. He then served as a Conservation Officer, and more recently as Sergeant of Enforcement Operations in Sudbury, Espanola and Manitoulin. As a testament to his expertise and hard work he was recently named the 2021 Conservation Officer of the Year. This award recognizes Koskela's investigative and collaborative skills. As well, his determination to see an investigation through to a successful outcome. The President of the Ontario Conservation Officer Association has described Peter as "a dedicated officer who goes above and beyond" while carrying out his duties. This award has a lengthy criteria.

Nominees must demonstrate many accomplishments which have had a deep impact on protecting the environment.
