



Many have reached out to me about powers of attorney, wills and estates. I thought I would share some helpful information on these important topics.

Powers of attorney are legal documents that name someone to make financial or health care decisions for another person while they are still alive, but unable to do so themselves.

Wills take effect when a person dies. It is a legal document that gives instructions on how a person would like their property (estate) distributed and names someone who will be responsible for carrying them out.

Community Interest

Do you remember when Joe Kuhle found a 150 year old canoe in Windy Lake??



In late summer of 1973 local Inco hoistman, Joe Kuhle and his wife Hannelie, pictured here with Dr. Ed Newberry, then the Chairman of the Native Studies Department at Laurentian Univerysity bringing the old canoe on shore.

Joe would dive, unemcumbered by sophisticated gear, into Windy Lake on a search for old submerged logs that drifted away from log booms at the turn of the century when Windy Lake was used for logging. He would find a log and turn it into a piece of furniture. On one dive Joe recovered, what has since identified, a 150 year old dug out canoe. This canoe is said to be a part of a 'use a canoe honour system' popular among travellers along the lake shores.

This specific canoe, more sturdy than birch bark, was left on the lakeshore to be available for the next passing fisherman thus saving them trouble of portaging their own craft.

Dr. Ed Newberry, Chairman of Native Studies at Laurentien University, at that time, confirmed Joe's find and provided historical background.

At the time the original article was published in 1973 the canoe was given to Dr. Newberry to study the craft with the assistance of other Anthropology specialists.

UPDATE to 2024 - Joes daughter, Birgit Kuhle-Locke, said that the canoe was given to Laurentien University and after a few pass alongs it ended up at the Canadian Canoe Museum.

On a visit to the museum Birgit said it was found in a storage room awaiting a new home.

The canoe, now 200 years old, can be viewed in the new Peterborough Canoe Museum set to open on May 11th, 2024

Janet's lifespan was October 10, 1951 to April 9, 2023 (Easter Sunday). She was married to Bill (the writer) for 50 years, 3 months and 13 days, not to mention a couple of courting years. Will came along, as a total surprise, after almost 10 years of marriage, in June of 1982 and we became a family.

How does one describe over 50 years together in a few short sentences and a paltry few adjectives? Some descriptors come to mind: love, hope, joy, faith, sorrow, sadness, gladness, dancing ,singing, grief, happiness, tears, smiles, frustrations, forgiveness, anxiety, worry, relief, pride, more love (always love). Know that when I see you "out and about" and we share some stories and maybe a laugh or ten that my joking and kibitzing is a way of coping for me, if I didn't laugh, I'd be crying and I don't have enough tissues for that scenario!
